Celebrating Asian American Pacific Islander Heritage Month in May

Asian American Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month is the celebration of Americans of Asian and Pacific Islander descent in the month of May. To celebrate this very special month, we must learn about the past, origins, and stories of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders who have contributed to the United States' history and how this month was developed. If knowledge is truly power, we can make this world a better place by stopping hate and discrimination with the newfound knowledge of our past.


What are the origins of the first AAPI Heritage Month? The first effort to recognize AAPI contributions to America started in the late 1970s, and it required 10 years of work to make it a celebration throughout the whole month. Originally, this celebration started as only a week, Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week. Then, in 1990, Congress lengthened the observance from a week to a month. In 1992, the month of May was designated as Asian/Pacific American Heritage Month.

Why is it celebrated in the month of May? AAPI Heritage Month is observed in the month of May because the first Japanese immigrants came to the United States on May 7, 1843. Also, May recognizes Golden Spike Day on May 10, 1869, which is the day of the completion of the transcontinental railroad. Chinese workers greatly contributed the building of the railroad.

Why is AAPI Heritage Month celebrated? The main reason AAPI Heritage Month is celebrated is because of Asian American's and Pacific Islander's significant contributions toward the United States. In politics, Kamala Harris is the first Asian American Vice President of America. There has also been movies and TV series with Asian American main characters. AAPI people also have a very important history in the United States. It is believed that the first Asians migrated to the current North America more than 15,000 years ago. During the 16th century, Filipinos who were fleeing from labor and enslavement during the Spanish galleon trade immigrated to America and established a St. Malo, Louisiana settlement. In the time of the California Gold Rush, many Asian immigrants went to the West Coast in search of gold, and they provided labor for gold mines, factories, and the transcontinental railroad.

What is anti-Asian racism, and how can we stop it? In the 1850s, Chinese workers in California were abused, robbed, and murdered. During the time period of World War II, people of Japanese descent were sent to internment camps. At the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, some people were racist towards Asians because of the origins of the coronavirus. Because of this racism, the AAPI Equity Alliance, Chinese for Affirmative Action, and the Asian American Studies Department of San Francisco State University began the Stop AAPI Hate movement on March 19, 2020. We can stop anti-Asian racism by rising up against Asian hate. If you happen to see someone getting bullied or hurt because of their race, tell a trusted adult such as your parents, teachers, or school counselors.

To celebrate AAPI Heritage Month, you could research about famous AAPI people. You could also research about the different cultures of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders. Most importantly, you could find a way to stand up against Asian hate and support any AAPI people you may know.



WHY IS TAYLOR SWIFT RE-**RECORDING HER ALBUMS?**

The Backstory

In 2006, 16 year old Taylor Swift got discovered by Scott Borchetta then got signed to Big Machine Records. During her time at Big Machine she was able to write and produce 6 Albums: Taylor Swift (her self titled debut album), Fearless, Speak Now, Red, 1989, and reputation. With-in these albums contains Taylor's major hits such as: Love Story, You Belong With Me, Shake It Off, Blank Space and More!



Masters & Scooter Braun

In 2018, Taylor's contract expired and she could then decide whether to resign or not. Taylor thought resigning with Big Machine would not benefit her future. Taylor's Team asked Big Machine if they could buy her masters (the amount of control of a album/song such as pay). At the time, Taylor knew Big Machine would sell the company and their catalog. Big Machine would deny the offer of Taylor earning her masters for her 6 albums. In June 2019, Big Machine and their catalog (Even Taylor's) would be sold to Scooter Braun for \$300,000,000. Taylor disapproved of this purchase because of who Braun managed and how he treated people. Braun managed singer Kanye West, Ariana Grande and more! If you didn't know, Taylor and Kanye had beef from the infamous 2009 VMA's and his song "Famous" and the 2016 edited phone call with Kanye West, Taylor Swift and Kim Kardashian.

Why Re-Record

In 2018, Taylor signed to Republic Records where she is able to own her masters. Since Taylor can't buy her masters, She will re-record her albums to overtake the masters that way. As of May of 2024, Taylor has 4 re-recorded albums starting with her 2008 album:

Fearless then Red, then Speak Now, and most recently 1989. If you see an album or a song that has "(Taylor Version)" at the end that means Taylor owns her album masters.

All that is left in her re-recording cycle is her Debut album: Taylor Swift and her 6th Album reputation

Watermelon Cupcakes Recipe:

- 1) In a mixing bowl combine the butter and sugar, beat using an electric mixer, 1-2 minutes until fluffy.
- 2) Add in egg whites, sour cream, milk, and vanilla extract. Beat lightly with the electric mixer.
- 3)In a separate mixing bowl combine the flour, baking powder, and salt. Gradually add the flour mixture to the wet ingredients a few spoonfuls at a time. Mix until just incorporated. Add in a small amount of green food coloring until you reach your desired green color.
- 4) Fill the muffin liners 1/2 to 3/4 full. Bake for 17-19 minutes at 350°F or until a few moist crumbs remain on a toothpick when inserted into the center. Allow the cupcakes to cool completely before adding frosting.

Watermelon Frosting Recipe:

- 1) Cream unsalted butter in a stand mixer until smooth and fluffy. Slowly add in powdered sugar and gradually beat it in.
- 2) Add in watermelon kool aid powder mix and red gel food coloring.
 - 3) Sprinkle mini chocolate chips on top for extra garnish.*measure to taste and proportion*

Ingredients:

Green food dye, mini chocolate chips, unsalted butter, granulated sugar, egg whites, sour cream, milk, salt, vanilla extract, all purpose flour, baking powder, powdered sugar, red gel food coloring, watermelon kool aid powder mix


