Definition: "to get in the way, as an obstacle"

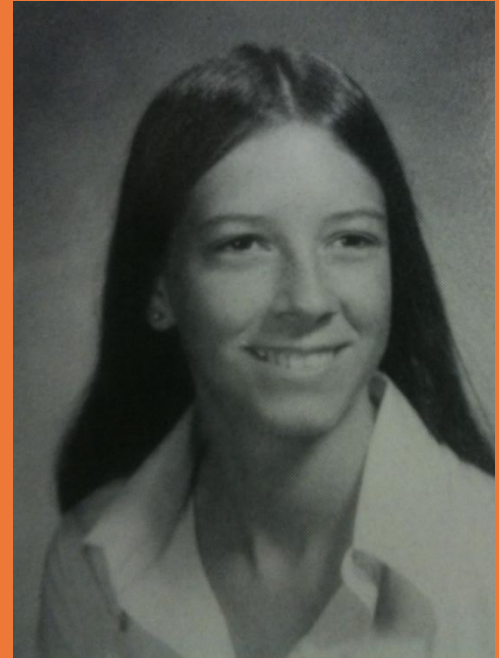
"Thunderstorms often interfere with our satellite signal and we are not able to watch our favorite shows."
